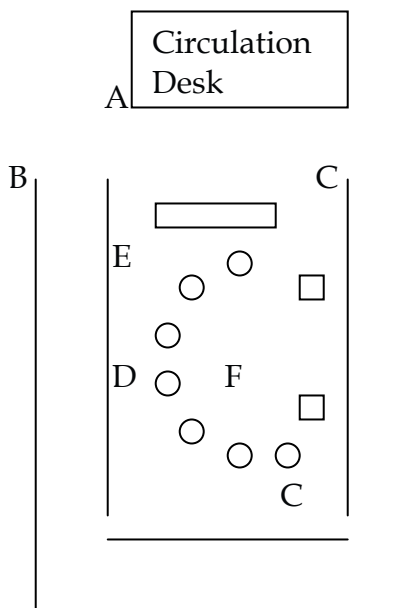
1. Take care of our library environment

Media Center/Library Arrangement

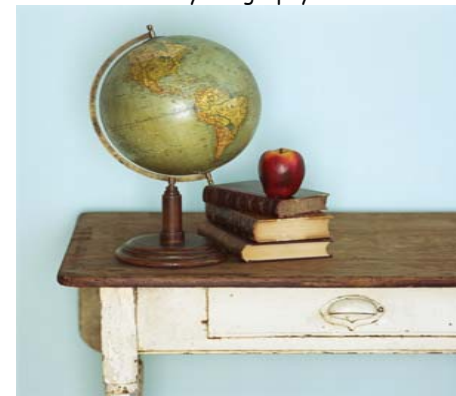


MAP KEY OF LIBRARY

Dewey Decimal Classification System

- 000-099 = General Information
- 100-199 = Psychology Philosophy
- 200-299 = Religion
- 300-399 = Social Science
- 400-499 = Language
- 500-599 = Science Mathematics
- 600-699 = Technology
- 700-799 = Arts and Recreation
- 800-899 = Literature
- 900-999 = History Geography



When looking for a particular book, refer to the call numbers on the spine of the book. Easy books will have an E on the top followed by the author's first letter or letters. Fiction books will have a F or Fic on the top followed by the author's first three letters of his/her last name. Nonfiction books are arranged according to the Dewey Classification system.

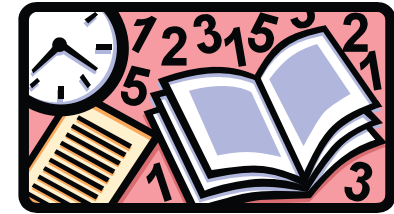
